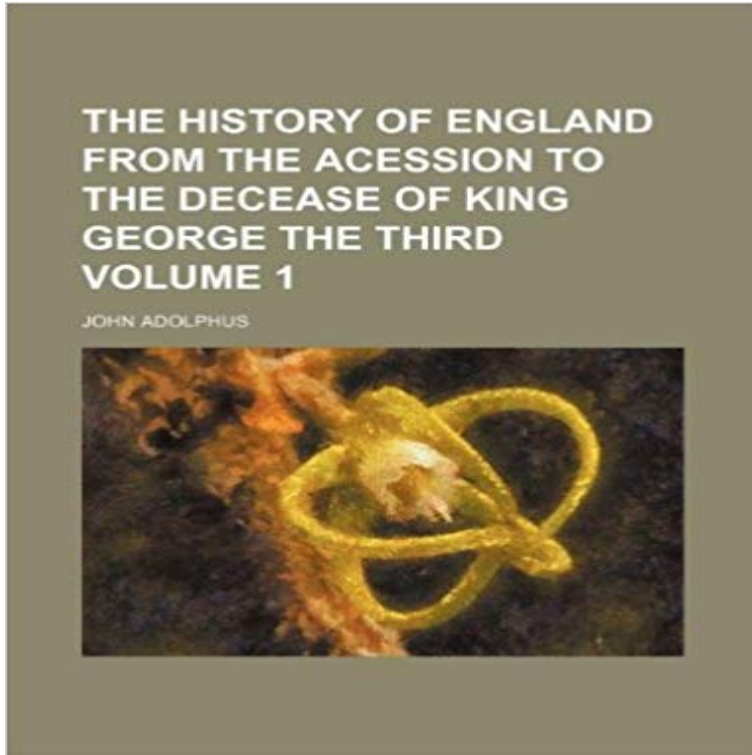

He said he was no patron of the people, expressed something like sarcasm against Lord Chatham, and challenged any lawyer to contradict him. To this defiance Lord Mansfield speedily responded, shewing, by clear legal arguments, that the power claimed for the crown, as stated, was utterly inconsistent with the constitution, particularly as established by the revolution. In his opposition to government on this point, his lordship displayed the dignified prudence becoming an eminent magistrate, who, in resisting the encroachment of power, will not give force to popular discontent. As actions had been commenced, and were likely to be tried before him, he would give no legal opinion; but whether the measure

were legal or not, he wished that no opposition should be offered to the add...
