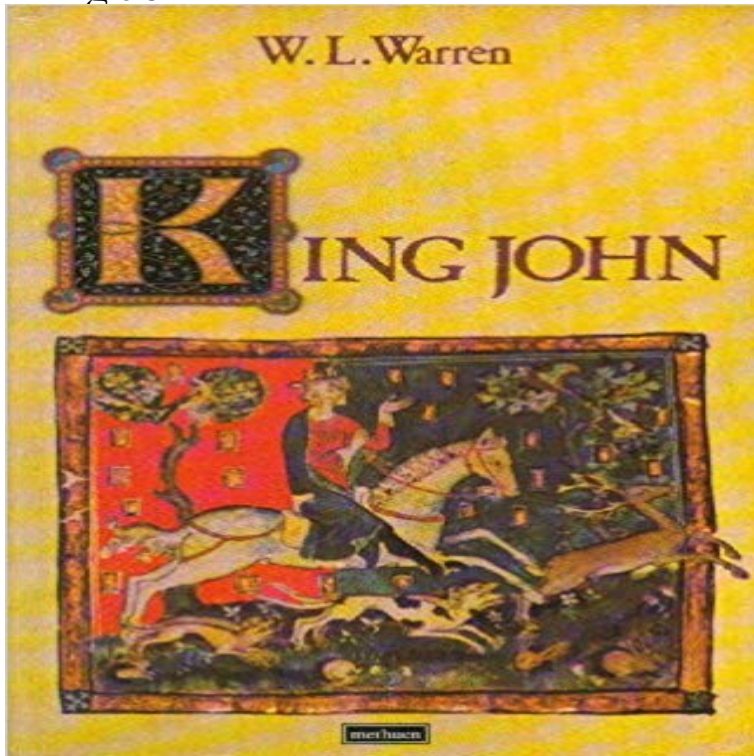


King John
