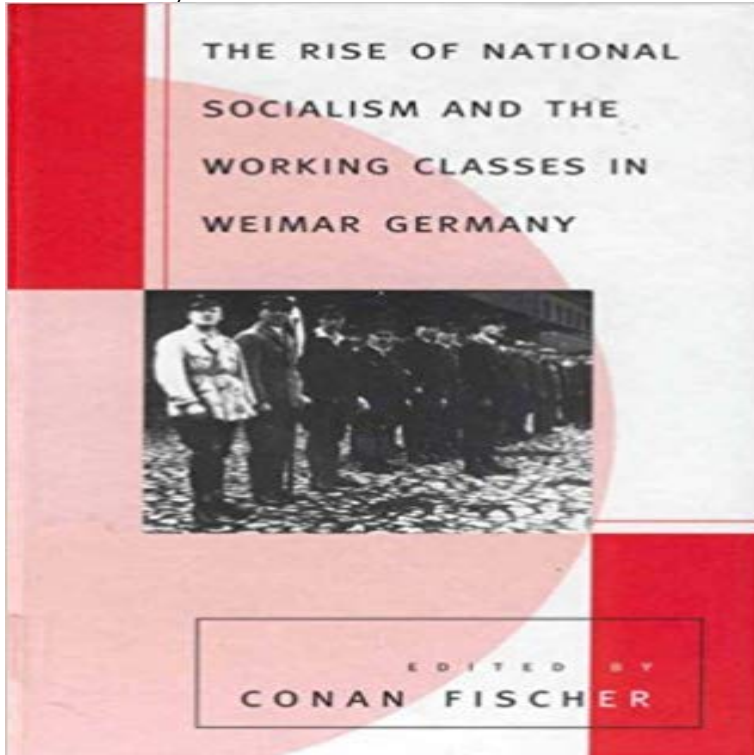


The Rise of National Socialism and the Working Classes in Weimar Germany
