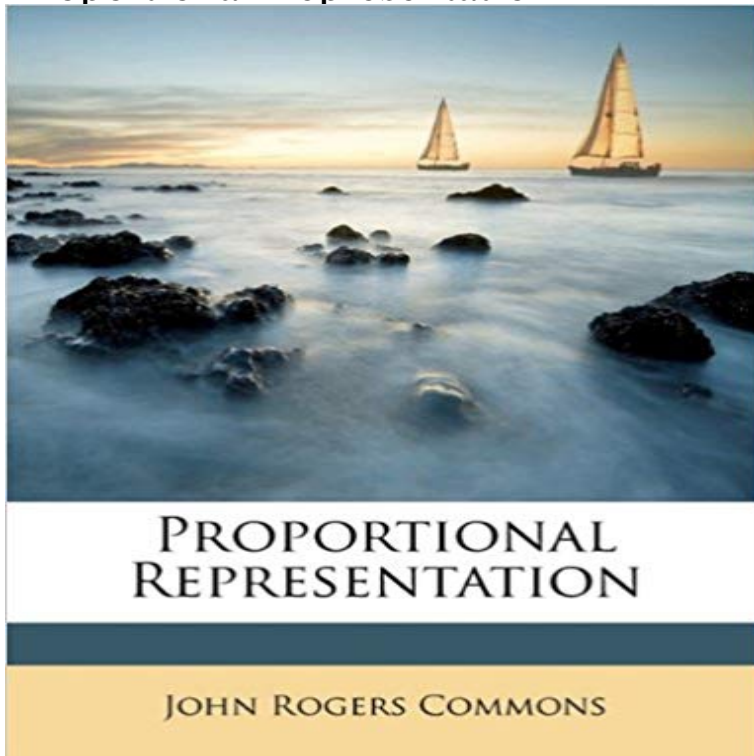


Proportional Representation
