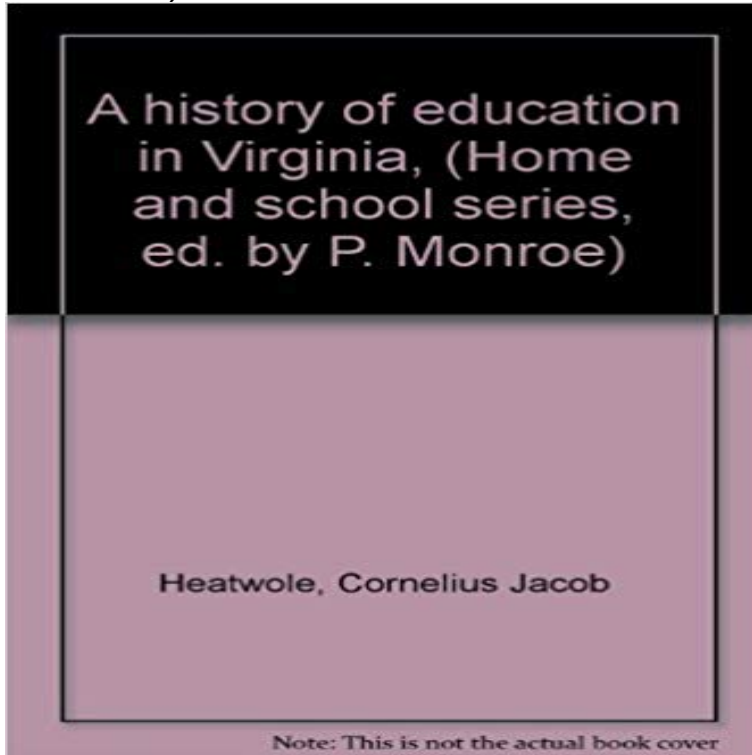


A history of education in Virginia, (Home and school series, ed. by P. Monroe)
